The turbulent changes taking place in today's global culture, church and Anglican Communion call for a refocusing of one of the primary tasks of the Church: making disciples of all ages, teaching them to obey all the Lord Jesus Christ has commanded. In response, the Global South Primates called for the creation of an Anglican Catechism in Outline, which was released Ash Wednesday 2008. This three-day symposium for clergy, Christian educators and academics will discuss both the historic Anglican Catechism and this most recent work. This gathering will include position papers, seminars, working groups and panel discussions, including presentations by Anglican scholars from Nashotah House, Trinity School for Ministry and elsewhere.
